**SB739** shows the final vote on the state budget which contains ~\$40 million for ~ 120,000 elective abortions each year. A pro-life NO vote on SB739 accounts for 25% of the final vote grade.

Sponsor Score. Sponsoring a pro-life bill adds 10% to the score; sponsoring a pro-life amendment to the budget adds 5%.

Sponsoring a pro-abortion bill/amendments subtracts from the legislator's score. Thus scores above 100% and below 0% are possible.

Vote 1: SB75 (Peace) is the Senate version of the state budget and contained full abortion funding. Pro-life vote is No.

**Vote 2:** SB101 (Brulte) would fund a \$1 million publicity campaign to apprise desperate mothers of designated locations where they may leave their newborn child rather than abandoning it. Pro-life vote is Yes.

**Vote 3:** SB111 (Alpert) would reduce the quality of medical procedures performed at abortion clinics by waiving physician oversight of medical assistants performing those procedures. Pro-life vote is No.

**Vote 4:** SB231 (Ortiz) seeks to acquire federal funds, thereby freeing up state funds to expand Medi-Cal services at school sites (school-based clinics) which must provide confidential reproductive services to minors. Pro-life vote is No.

**Vote 5:** SB751 (committee) made changes to implement the Budget Act of 2001 for the Medi-Cal Program which must provide abortion funding. Pro-life vote is No.

**Vote 6:** SB780 (Ortiz) defines "anti-reproductive rights crimes" and expands on the federal Freedom of Access to Clinic Entrances Act which is already in effect, compounding punishment for the same crime. Invites law enforcement to profile pro-lifers. Pro-life vote is No.

**Vote 7:** SB1058 (Escutia) perpetuates the teen pregnancy prevention program that depends on condoms and contraceptives with abortion as backup when these fail. Pro-life vote is No.

**Vote 8:** SB1169 (Alpert) makes provisions for pharmacists to initiate "morning after" emergency contraceptive drug therapy which aborts the human embryo. This is a companion bill to AB826. Pro-life vote is No.

**Vote 9:** SJR3 (Karnette) petitions the President and other national leaders to preserve the U.S. Supreme Court's Roe v. Wade decision which legalized abortion on demand. Pro-life vote is No.

**Vote 10:** SJR23 (Speier) petitions the President and Congress to further expand abortion of demand in California through federal funding without waivers. Pro-life vote is No.

**Vote 11:** AB32 (Richman) would draw into Medi-Cal or Healthy Start programs an increased number of families and individuals having incomes up to 250% poverty level. These programs offer confidential reproductive services. Pro-life vote is No.

**Vote 12:** AB59 (Cedillo) extends Medi-Cal coverage, which includes confidential reproductive services, to families having incomes up to 250% poverty level. Pro-life vote is No.

**Vote 13:** AB95 (Cardenas) is the Assembly version of the state budget and contained full abortion funding. Pro-life vote is No.

**Vote 14:** AB130 (Cardenas) establishes the Family Planning Access Care and Treatment Program that offers contraceptives which may be abortifacient. Pro-life vote is No.

**Vote 15:** AB558 (Briggs) requires written parental permission for a child to be released from public school, even for confidential reproductive services. Pro-life vote is Yes.

**Vote 16:** AB826 (Cohn) makes provisions for pharmacists to initiate "morning after" emergency contraceptive drug therapy which aborts the human embryo. This is a companion bill to SB1169. Pro-life vote is No.

**Vote 17:** AB892 (Keeley) proposes to bridge the gap between government funding and self-sufficiency for Healthy Start programs, which have access to Medi-Cal reproductive services. Pro-life vote is No.

**Vote 18:** AB 951 (Florez) issues temporary licenses to clinics (including abortion clinics) for up to 4 years preceding the mandatory investigation to assure clinics comply with prescibed health standards. Pro-life vote is No.

**Vote 19:** ACA5 (Wyman) proposed to amend the state Constitution to require parental notification prior to an abortion being performed on their minor child. Pro-life vote is Yes.

**Vote 20:** SB 739 (Peace) is the final version of the California State Budget for 2001-02 and contains full abortion funding of ~\$40 million to abort ~120,000 babies. Pro-life vote is No.
