The Facts and the Voting Record

NO PARENTAL KNOWLEDGE

Children are taught how to obtain birth control, the morning after pill, and get an abortion - without parental knowledge.

SUPPLEMENTAL MATERIAL

Children are exposed to supplemental materials such as *It's Perfectly Normal*, a graphic book that illustrates nude males and females in sexually explicit bedroom scenes.

CURRICULUM

The approved curriculums normalize and celebrate anal sex and sex outside of marriage.



ONLINE LINKS

Children are exposed to online links to read interviews of straight and gay students discussing penilevaginal and anal sex.



Children are exposed to advice encouraging multiple sex partners, homosexual and bisexual sex, and exploration of sexual expression.

CSE IS REQUIRED

CSE is required in middle and high school, but the gender identity portion can be legally taught anytime, without parental knowledge as early as kindergarten.
